REMINDER: PLEASE TRIM YOUR TREES, BUSHES, VEGETATION & LOW HANGING BRANCHES OVER AND ADJACENT TO PUBLIC & PRIVATE ROADS

The <u>2024 July Newsletter</u> included an article about maintaining safe passage on public and private roads.(.<u>https://northbay-wi.us/wp-content/uploads/2024/07/2024-july-newsletter-1.pdf</u>). **If you have not already scheduled a contractor to perform the work, please do so before the end of September.** If work has not been completed by that time, the Village may take action and the property owner will be billed.

North Bay property owners adjacent to Erie Street need to maintain both sides of the fence. Trees must be trimmed <u>both back and up</u>, so that vehicles on Erie Street can pass under them. Bushes and grass must also be trimmed back from the curb to maintain safe passage. If you have not already scheduled a contractor to perform the work, please do so before the end of September.

SAFETY TIPS FROM POLICE CHIEF SHARRETT

HOME

- Install lighting, such as motion lights or dusk to dawn detector lights, on your home's exterior.
- Trim shrubbery around your home to eliminate hiding places.
- Your address should be clearly visible from the street for emergency and identification purposes.
- Close and lock your garage door when you are not nearby.
 Place valuables stored in the garage in a locking device not visible from the street when the garage door is open.
- Do not leave bikes unattended. Lock your bikes, even if you are going to be away for only a few moments.
- If you sleep on the second floor of your home, keep all first-floor doors and windows closed and locked.



VEHICLE

- Always lock your car doors after entering or leaving your vehicle.
- Roll up your windows when you leave your car. Make sure to take your keys with you.
- **Do not leave valuables in the car.** If you must leave possessions in your vehicle keep them out of sight or hidden in the trunk.
- Before you get into your car, check the backseat and around the car. Lock your doors once inside the car.
- Park in well-lighted areas. Have your car keys in your hand so you don't have to linger before entering your car.
- Check the interior of your vehicle for intruders before entering your car. If you think you are being followed, drive to a public place or a police or sheriff's station.
- Don't stop to aid motorists by the side of the road. Make a phone call requesting help for them.
